Festival 2021 - Our Covid-19 approach

The Covid-19 pandemic has drastically affected the lives of the whole world. We send out our sincere condolences to all who have lost loved ones during this time.

The global, UK and local situations regarding the containment of Covid-19 are constantly changing and there is no way of knowing at this stage where we will be in May 2021, our festival time.

We ask that you enter the festival as you normally would by 14 February 2021 in line with the classes offered in the syllabus and we will keep you fully updated should there be any changes affecting your entry.

We will be fully compliant in respect of any government and venue guidelines at the time of our festival and risk assess each activity and performance area on a regular basis. We will amend the classes for the 2021 festival if, nearer the time, we deem it necessary.

Any entry fees paid by entrants or teachers will be refunded by the festival in the event of our cancellation of any classes.

Our approach in the event of the festival not taking place "live", will be for entrants to video each of their performances (on phone or camera) and send them by email to the festival. Performances will be sent to the relevant adjudicator, who will watch every performance carefully and give written feedback which will be posted to you with a certificate and a medal if appropriate. Performances, with permission, will be uploaded to the festival website for everyone's enjoyment.

The enjoyment and safety of entrants, volunteers, parents, teachers and the venues we use will always be at the forefront of everything we do in the festival.

Our Adjudicators

MUSIC

Nadia Hinson GRSM(Hons) LRAM LTCL

Nadia graduated from the Royal Academy of Music after having studied the violin with Manoug Parikian and the piano with Jean Harvey. She was awarded first prize for Aural studies and her quartet won the string chamber prize in her final year. Nadia was the featured soloist playing the Lark Ascending and Bach double violin concerto for the Benslow Trust at St. James' Piccadilly having been awarded an instrument to continue her studies. Other concertos in her repertoire include performances of the Mendelssohn, Mozart no.3 and 4, Haydn in C, De Beriot, Viotti, and works by Beethoven and Finzi.

She began her career as a freelance violinist playing in many London based orchestras. As an accompanist to singers and instrumentalists, she met her musician husband Nigel and together they founded the Veloce Ensemble (string quartet and clarinet quintet) touring throughout Britain performing specially commissioned works for that genre. Appearances at festivals and stately homes inspired a regular concert series at Belvoir Castle and Holmepierrepont Hall.

As a recitalist throughout the East Midlands, Nadia has been highlighted in festivals and BBC features locally. She is also currently the owner and director of the Hinson School of Music in Nottingham, and is an International examiner for the ABRSM, an adjudicator for The British and International Federation of Festivals, and a member of the Royal Society of Musicians.

Nadia has recently been appointed a senior consultant for the LEAD Academy trust, involved in developing music departments in schools in Nottinghamshire, and leading workshops to encourage and involve as many youngsters as possible in experiencing music and the arts in large scale productions and showcase concerts. She has set up composition workshops to inspire children to explore feelings and ideas through music and is a mentor for the Trust to develop self-confidence and communication through learning and performance.

SPEECH AND DRAMA

Rebecca Vines MA, BA, FRSA, FVCM, LLAM, LALAM, GSMD, ALAM, ATCL, ANEA, MSTSD (Adj.)

Rebecca trained as a journalist at Cardiff University, during which time she wrote a weekly column for The Guardian newspaper before moving to London to study with The Actors' Company. Appointed Head of Speech & Drama at an Independent School in Cheltenham in 2003, her pupils have been offered training places at all the major UK acting schools – working for the BBC, Channel 4, RSC and the film production company – Working Title. She is the Founder of Close Up Theatre, which has won the elite Sell-Out Status for nine years at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival, and Artistic Director for No Prophet Theatre. ebecca believes that performing in festivals not only encourages an appreciation of the arts but also develops the communication and presentation skills so important in today's world. Rebecca is delighted to be adjudicating the Speech & Drama classes at the Northampton Festival of the Performing Arts in 2021 and wishes everyone an enjoyable as well as a positive experience.

For instance, if you are Grade 5 piano entrant then you should enter Intermediate grade classes and play a piece of that level (ie a grade 5 piece, not a grade 4 piece). This rule applies to all piano and instrumental classes.

LIVE ACCOMPANIMENT

We do not provide an official festival accompanist. You may bring your own accompanist, but if you don't have one then the list on our website might help you – please contact them direct. (www.northamptonfestival.co.uk) Please contact us if you have difficulty. If you engage an accompanist you must expect to pay for their services and this is your responsibility and not that of the festival. We advise that you engage an accompanist as soon as you have entered the festival as they get busy and you might also like to have a rehearsal before your performance.

You can use backing tracks for any of your performances. Please bring them on a device (ie USB stick / Bluetooth) or on CD. All vocal performances will be unmiked.

- 1. All entries must be made on the official entry forms, EITHER by email to contact@northamptonFestival.co.uk, OR by post and submitted as a paper entry reaching the Festival Chair on or before the closing date as given in the syllabus.
- 2. Late entries will not be accepted.
- 3. Please enter within your grade band. For instance, if you are grade 5 piano entrant then you should enter intermediate grade classes and play a piece of that level (ie a grade 5 piece, not a grade 4 piece). This rule applies to all piano and instrumental classes.
- 4. No entry will be accepted UNLESS accompanied by the Entry Fee with Paper Entry Form or Proof of payment with Payment Reference as indicated on Entry Form. An emailed confirmation of entries will be sent to entrants with an email address. Entry fees will only be returned as a decision of the committee. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 5. Each entrant must be in the appropriate school year group for each class. Group entries must belong to the specified year groupings.
- 6. Performers in all ensemble classes must be bona fide members of the group concerned.

7. Entrants may perform only once in each class except in duet, trio or ensemble classes where an entrant may perform more than once provided a different part is played.

GENERAL

- 8. The Festival is for amateurs, which is defined as one who does not receive more than out-of-pocket expenses for services rendered in those branches of the arts with which the Festival is concerned. This rule does not apply to a conductor.
- 9. The committee reserves the right to limit, cancel or subdivide any class.
- 10. The committee reserves the right to substitute any Adjudicator without notice.
- 11. NO photographs or recordings may be taken DURING ANY PERFORMANCE but may be taken after the performance WITH RELEVANT PERMISSION.
- 12. The Festival committee cannot accept responsibility for property left at the venues during the Festival
- 13. Confirmation of venue, date, and time of classes will be available on the festival website (www.northamptonfestival.co.uk) or in the printed programme when available.

OWN CHOICE PIECES

- 13. A copy of Own Choice pieces (including choices from examination grades) must be provided for the Adjudicator's use on the day and be marked with name and class number, otherwise the performance will be judged non-competitively.
- 14. Where music has an accompaniment, this should be used but the Festival will NOT be providing an official accompanist. You can use backing tracks for any of your performances. Please bring them on a device (ie USB stick / Bluetooth) or on CD.
- 15. Time Limits apply to actual performance time, which does not include tuning time, setting of the stage or introduction. Time Limits will be strictly adhered to and if exceeded the performance may not be placed.

ASSESSMENT & AWARDS

- 16. Whilst performance in some classes has a competitive element, it is not an examination and the intention is to offer a performance opportunity in a supportive environment.
- 17. A Category system as recommended by Federation of Festivals is used as a method of assessment:

OutstandingAn exceptional performance technically and artisticallyDistinctionAn excellent performance technically and artisticallyCommendedA convincing performance technically and artistically

Merit A capable performance showing some artistic appreciation

and/or technical ability

Moderate A performance showing development of technique and/or

communication

Fair A performance limited in its communication at present The Adjudicator's decision will be regarded as final.

18. No entrant, teacher or interested party may discuss any aspect of the Festival with an Adjudicator before, during or after classes, except at the invitation of the Adjudicator.

- 19. Every entrant will receive a Performance Certificate and the Adjudicator's comments. After Adjudication, Certificates and Awards will be presented. Awards may be withheld if, in the opinion of the Adjudicator, sufficient merit is not shown.
- 20. Trophies remain the property of the Northampton Festival and should be returned to the Trophies Secretary one month prior to the next Festival

COPYRIGHT

- 21. It is the entrant's responsibility to ensure that the provisions of the 1956 and 1988 Copyright Acts are observed. The Music Publishers' Association has revised its Code of Practice insofar as Own Choice Works selected from volumes is concerned: When selecting from a publication containing several different works and where the required work is not published separately, one copy may be made for the Adjudicator. The copy will be retained by the Festival and destroyed after the event. This permission does not apply to set works nor to making copies for accompanists who must always be given an original copy from which to play. Single copies of items may not be photocopied without the prior permission of the Copyright holder. For further information please visit the British & International Federation of Festival website: Federation copyright details
- 22. Our Speech and Drama section is pleased to announce that it has entered into an agreement with the Authors' Licensing and Collecting Society. This means that performers do not have to seek Copyright permission for any poetry, prose or solo dramatic items performed to a limit of 10 minutes. Performers and teachers will be delighted to know that their participation in this Festival means that authors will be directly reimbursed as a consequence of their works being performed at this Festival.
- 23. Solo dramatic items must be announced with title and author at the time of performance to qualify for copyright indemnity, and the performer must not change the words or gender of the character.
- 24. Duologues and group dramatic activity are not covered by this agreement and copyright for these items should be sought by performers at time of entry.
- 25. Performers in Own Choice verse classes will be required to submit a copy to the Adjudicator's Steward stating TITLE AUTHOR PUBLISHER.

SPONSORSHIP AND SUBSCRIPTION

We are a self-financing charitable organisation run by a team of dedicated volunteers. We need help financially, to enable the Festival - your Festival - to maintain a service of the highest quality and to plan future festivals with confidence.

FRIENDS & SPONSORS

Members of the public are invited to support the Festival financially by becoming Friends or Sponsors.

Friends are invited to subscribe a minimum of £20 per annum towards the Festival costs. Sponsors are invited to subscribe a minimum of £30 per annum of which this year, £20 will be used to purchase a voucher to be presented to the winner of a class selected by the Sponsor. These figures are subject to review at the discretion of the Committee. Class Sponsors have the opportunity to select the class for which their award will be made, subject to that class not already being sponsored. If the chosen class has insufficient entries to justify an award, the committee will decide to whom to award the sponsorship. Sponsors are encouraged to present their own award where possible, but we ask that they make themselves known to the Adjudicator's Steward before the class commences. Further details may be obtained from the Secretary or the Treasurer

ENDOWMENT FUND

It has become increasingly difficult for the festival committee to administer the present system of trophies and to bear the insurance costs. It is therefore the Committee's aim to develop an Endowment Fund and to encourage future donors to support the Festival by contributing to the fund from which Awards can be made, existing events encouraged, and new ones sponsored.

Because of this, the Committee has decided not to accept further gifts of any kind of trophy. If anyone wishes to make a donation, that generosity will be recorded in a list published in the festival programme. This may well be relevant to commemorate someone as a form of memorial.

If this is something which appeals to you please get in touch with the Treasurer or the General Secretary who will be delighted to discuss the possibility with you.

VOLUNTEERING AT THE FESTIVAL – CAN YOU HELP?

There is no need for musical or acting ability to enter the spirit of our Festival. All that is required is for you to be keen to help the organisers by giving a little of your time during the period of the Festival. One half day session, normally about three hours, would be an enormous help. A prearranged rota is compiled which provides coverage at the various venues in Northampton to greet entrants, parents, teachers and audience, sell programmes and help generally with the tasks of the session. Guidelines, with an informal training morning/evening are provided. Stewards are really important in the smooth running of the Festival sessions – your volunteering to help in this way would be greatly appreciated. Child Protection Policy



Northampton Festival of the Performing Arts Child Protection Policy

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech work for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and our member Festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and our member Festivals.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual
 orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or
 abuse.
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare.

The purpose of the policy:

- to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members.
- to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the
 event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of,
 harm.

We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them.
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers.
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers.
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately.
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

Child Licensing

Please note that both the Own Choice and Set Piece classes in the Drama Festival will be scheduled during the school day.

If your child is performing as part of a school group then the school will cover all aspects of child licensing on your behalf.

If your child is entering as an individual not entered by the school then he / she will require to be covered by a performance licence. The parent or guardian is liable to apply to the local council covering their home postcode. To check which council covers you, please go to the government website https://www.gov.uk/apply-for-child-performance-licence where you will be directed accordingly.
